

Section 13 Kent Mountain Preserve

The 25-acre Kent Mountain Preserve was donated to the Kent Land Trust in 2013 by Kent resident Kevin R. Alger. It offers a small but well-maintained out-and-back trail of about a half mile in length on the western slope of Kent Mountain. To find the Preserve, drive north on Route 7 to Studio Hill Road and the George Lawrence Nelson Homestead on the corner. Turn right and drive to the end of Studio Hill Road to find a Kent Land Trust kiosk and parking area with space for 2-3 cars.

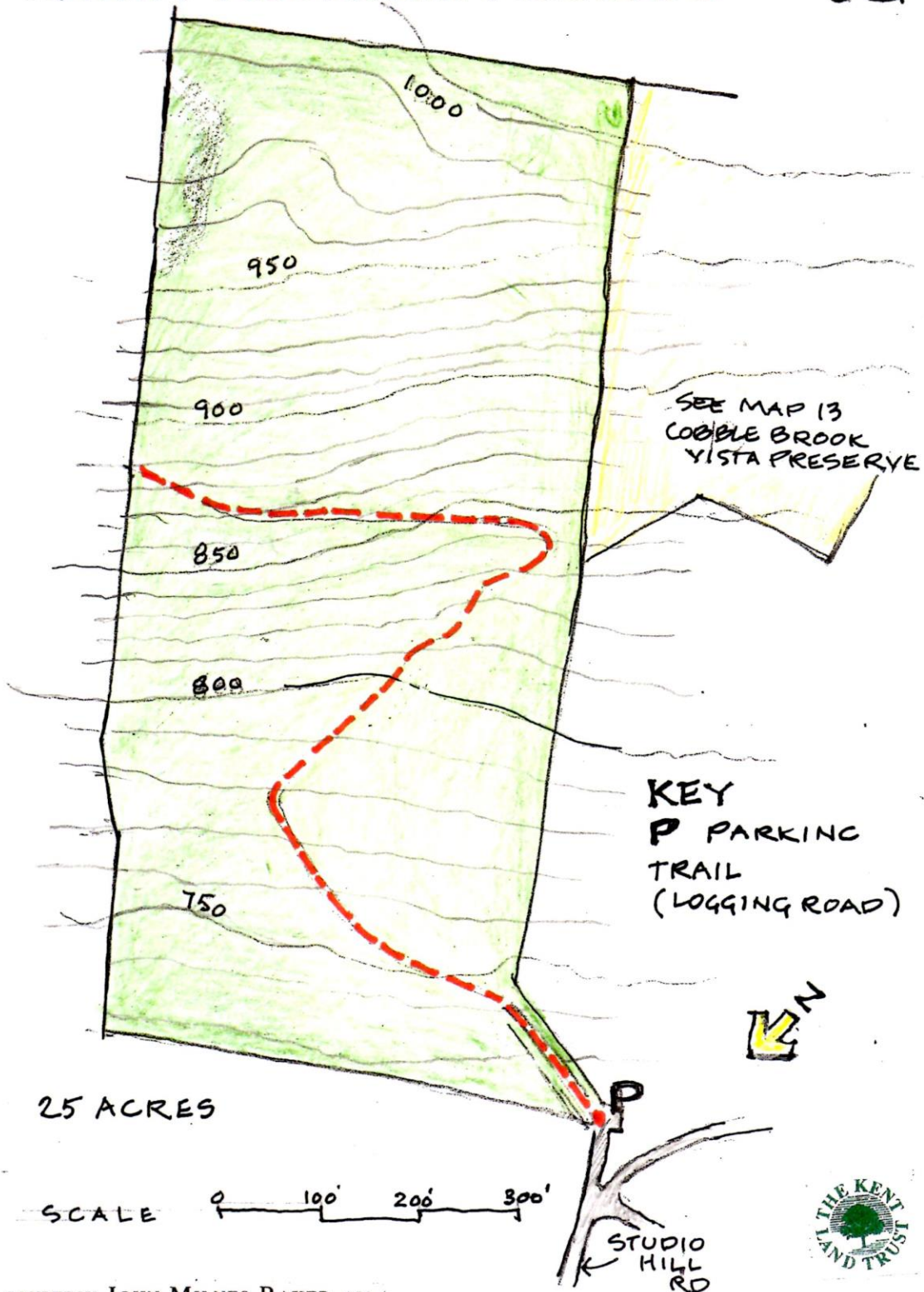


Because of the property's densely forested cover and its closeness to several other conserved lands in the area (see #9. Kent Falls State Park, #10. The Tobin Preserve and #13. Cobble Brook Vista,) this preserve is part of a well-traveled corridor for native wildlife including bobcat, bear, white-tailed deer, red fox and coyote. Over much of its length the trail follows an old wood road, making for easy footing most of the year.
